• PCW is a non-profit, membership organization established in 1964 for independent school communities (grades K through 12) in the Washington, DC metropolitan area

PCW Membership

- Membership of 58 independent schools, representing approximately 27,000 students
- Schools include:
 - Lower Schools (46), Middle Schools (43) and
 Upper Schools (33)
 - Schools in DC (23), Maryland (23), Virginia (12)
 - Co-ed (45), single gender/female (8), single gender/male (5)
 - Religiously-affiliated schools (24), secular (34)

Structure/Financial Support

- PCW is managed by a board of 16 all-volunteer members, with a part-time paid Administrator
- Each PCW Board member is responsible for providing regular updates to 3-5 member schools, through emails/contacts with PCW representatives (usually parents) appointed by the schools
- Member schools pay annual dues to PCW

- Nine programs each year, for parents, students and administrators of member schools
- Each year a theme is chosen:
 - 2017-2018 Raising 21st Century Citizens
 - 2016-2017 -- Minding the Brain: Research, Education and Parenting
 - 2015-2016 -- Between Park and Overdrive: Finding Balance in Our Families
 - 2014-2015 -- Rethinking Success
 - 2013-2014 -- Communication and Reaching Out: Creating Healthier Communities
