Program Descriptions

The Parents Council of Washington (PCW) promotes excellence in education by fostering communication among parents, students and independent schools in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. This mission is accomplished via multiple programs, resources and networking opportunities connecting schools, sharing ideas and engaging parents.

PCW programs for member school communities focus on relevant issues, research and practices in the fields of child development, education and parenting. All programs (with the exception of the Deans' Event) result in follow-up written summaries, posted and available on the PCW website. These and numerous other resources are readily available for all to access at www.parentscouncil.org.

Programs are designed for differing audiences. Below is a description of the types of programs offered throughout the academic year with information on the respective target audience.

Orientation

Orientation presents member schools with insight from a highly-regarded speaker, as well as an overview of PCW and what it has to offer. PCW Representatives and PA Presidents meet and network with other school leaders and are provided guidance on how to best participate in PCW programs and utilize resources available throughout the school year. In recent years, speakers have included William Stixrud and Ned Johnson, Susanna Jones, Elinor Scully, Patricia Lyons, and Michelle Kriebel.

Speakers

The speaker series features prominent authors, educators and experts presenting on today's issues, theories and practices impacting our independent school communities. In past years, we have had two speakers per year – one in Fall and the other in Spring. PCW speakers have included Lynn Lyons, Beth Kobliner, Glenn Whitman, Tina Payne Bryson, Jessica Lahey, Susan Cain, Brigid Schulte, Ron Lieber, Brad Sachs, Annie Fox, Ned Johnson, Robert Kosasky, and William Stixrud.

Lower School Forum

A panel presentation in which presenters share thoughts on best practices for raising healthy, connected and engaged learners. Member school parents are invited to come listen, share perspectives and seek advice in an open and frank exchange focusing on child development, education and parenting.

Movie Screening

A screening of a current and informative movie related to parenting and/or education. In the past few years, PCW has shown *Screenagers*.

Best Practices Forum

This forum assembles a panel of 3-4 administrators and/or faculty for a discussion and Q & A session on best practices related to the PCW annual theme. Attendees include member school administrators, educators and parents. Prior to the program, PCW asks all member schools to submit their best practices on the chosen topic. Subsequent to the program, PCW writes a summary of panelist presentations and combines it with school submissions into a comprehensive e-binder on the topic. E-binders are a tremendous resource for member schools and are maintained on the PCW website for access by interested parties. Prior topics include: Promoting Student Well-Being, Raising 21st Century Citizens, Your Child's Brain, Finding Balance, Re-Thinking Success, Community Service, 21st Century Technology, Kindness, Diversity, Parent Networking, and Students & Stress.

Upper School Student Leader Breakfast

This program is open to school-selected juniors and seniors from member schools (2 students per school). The morning program (which includes both small and large group sessions) is a confidential and moderated forum in which student leaders explore topics relevant to high school life. A summary of the discussion, with no attribution to or identifying information on individual participants, is prepared and shared with Deans of Students (*see Deans' Event below*).

Middle School Student Leader Breakfast

The middle school breakfast is for seventh grade students, accompanied by a school counselor or administrator. Each member school selects two students to attend. Students discuss relevant issues in both large and small groups, with the guidance of a moderator. Topics often include self-image, technology, social status, communication, academics, etc. At the same time, in a separate session, middle school counselors meet for a discussion of common interests and concerns.

Deans' Event

A unique opportunity for upper school Deans of Students to come together and collaboratively and confidentially explore issues of shared interest. Prior to the event, for discussion purposes, Deans receive a summary of issues and insights from the Upper School Student Leader Breakfast (with no attribution to or identification of any specific student or school).

PA Presidents' Monthly Discussions

An opportunity for incoming member school Parent Association Presidents to gain insight, perspective and tips from outgoing PA Presidents on "What I know now that I wish I knew then." The meeting allows PA Presidents to speak with their peers from other member schools. They have the opportunity to hear differing approaches and discuss common problems affecting all PA Presidents.

Who We Are

Established in 1964 to create connections, collaborations and community around education and parenting, PCW is governed by a rotating volunteer Board of Directors. All members of the Board (16 at present) are parents of member school students or graduates, serving 3-year terms. The Board, with the help of a part-time administrator, organizes and coordinates all programs and resources.

Mission

To promote excellence in education by fostering communication among parents, students and independent schools in the Washington, DC area through programs, resources and networking opportunities.

Who We Serve

Eligible members are independent schools (Preschool-12) in the Washington, DC metropolitan area, paying annual dues based on type of school and enrollment, and appointing school representatives to liaison with PCW to benefit their school communities via programs, resources and networking opportunities.

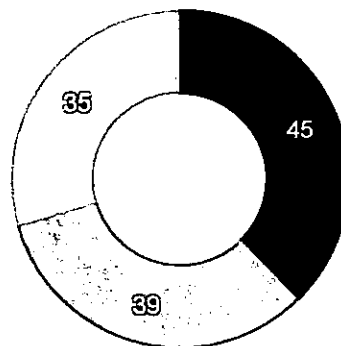

What We Offer

PCW provides member school communities with robust programming, resources, and networking opportunities all pertaining to education, child development and/or parenting.

➤ ANNUAL PROGRAMS

- **Orientation Program** – A gathering of PCW School Representatives and Parent Association (PA) Presidents.
- **Speaker Series Events** – Typically two per year, intended for all in our member school communities.
- **Lower and Middle School Forum** – Panel or speaker focused on our younger students, intended for all member lower and middle school communities.
- **Movie Screening/Panel/Workshop** – An event focused on a current topic of interest for all in our member school communities.
- **Deans of Students' Breakfast** – Hosted for upper school Deans of Students as a follow up to the Upper School Student Leader Breakfast.
- **Upper School and Middle School Student Leader Breakfasts** – Moderator led breakfast for school selected leaders to share ideas and opinions. Middle School breakfast includes a professional development session for chaperones.
- **Informal Discussions for PA Presidents** – Monthly informal discussion throughout the year.
